Thanks for sharing! I can contribute any background info you need. They sent me an email some time ago saying they were going to lobby for an exemption but I told them go ahead, no way they would or should be exempted from ESC or VSMP. I told them maybe for exemption from the post-construction water quality requirements but the reality is it is so easy for them to meet post-construction with conserved open space (when there is no issue with ownership).

I'm attaching a letter I shared with Drew yesterday. This was a result of a huge mess they made out of a trail construction near Breaks Interstate Park. They claim to be confused on when they needed a permit or ESC from the county.

I'm also attaching an email exchange that gives a little more background. Also, Spearhead Trails has been a huge topic for our region for nearly two years. We've really tried to change attitudes and construction practices with them--we even hosted a specialized training just for ESC training for trail building. 25 of Spearhead staff attended. There's also controversy as The Clinch Coalition opposes the trails and has FOIA our records twice.

The permit exemptions in our cgp come from the federal rule. I'm pretty sure that even if this activity is exempted under state law, if for any such project land disturbance equals one acre or more, it must be covered by a federal permit. In other words, it would still be unpermitted under federal law.

I'm not advocating this but we could exempt it from post construction stormwater requirements under state law. I can't tell if they're asking us to eliminate the permit requirement or they are asking us to not require stormwater management. Would be glad to discuss.

I don't believe Frank Kilgore is involved in Spearhead Trails. His project was the Mendota Trail system over near Bristol, which is a rail-to-trail project similar to the Virginia Creeper Trail, and open only to bicycle and pedestrian. However, some of the same issues arose in that project over the "new construction" vs. "maintenance of existing" activities (cutting new paths, vs. maintaining the original railroad ROW, as well as auxiliary parking features).

Spearhead Trails is part of the Southwest Regional Recreational Authority (SRRA), which was created by legislation in March 2008, with the mandate to establish and maintain "...a system of recreational trails and appurtenant facilities, including trail-head centers, parking areas, camping facilities, picnic areas, recreational areas, historical or cultural interpretive sites, and other facilities..." in the SRRA area (basically the coal counties). Their focus thus far seems to be, All Terrain Vehicle (ATV) or Off-Highway Vehicle (OHV) trail construction, modeled after West Virginia's Hatfield-McCoy Trail System. Spearhead Trails currently advertises over 400 miles of trails within their network. https://spearheadtrails.com/

	I told you I would send the language change suggested to secure Spearhead an exemption from DEQ. We are a secondary user of linear trails, which are exempt from some regulations. The language change would include recreational trails in that exemption and hopefully expand on that to include our

	trail building as well. As we talked, it is preferable that we come to some understanding that may omit the need for a language change. I will leave that to your good judgement and that of Clark's. We are grateful for the relationship	
	we have with DEQ and do not want to harm that in any way.
